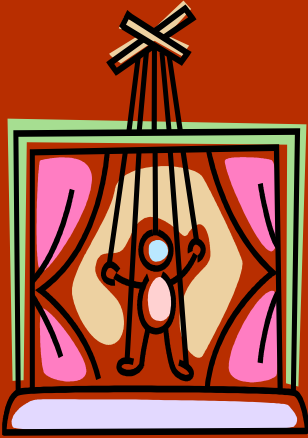
Hidden Diamonds?

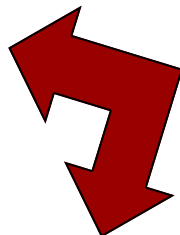
